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		Know the alphabet and then move on to sounds represented by more than one letter. Read and write CVC words containing phase 3 phonemes. Learn letter names. Read captions, sentences and questions. Read and spell red words from phase 2 and 3. On completion of this phase, children will have learnt the 'simple code' i.e. One grapheme for each phoneme in the English language.
