Number and Place Value: Recognise the relationship between counting sequences. Find the step size of the sequence by finding the difference between two numbers, including decimals. Describe and complete sequences. Round to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000. Investigate patterns. Compare and order positive and negative numbers.

Addition and Subtraction: Use formal columnar methods to add and subtract up to 4-digit numbers with multiple exchanges. Solve problems using place value equipment and formal columnar methods. Known facts to 100. Mentally calculate what is added to any 3- and 4-digit numbers to make the next 10/100.

Multiplication and division: Recall multiplication and division facts in 10, 2, 5, 3, 4, 8, 7, 9, 12 times tables. Multiply 2- and 3- digit numbers by a single digit using partitioning and written methods. Understand remainders. Regular problem-solving opportunities using known facts.
