<u>History</u>

English



In English, we will be focusing on writing:

- A warning tale.
- An explanation text.
- A suspense tale
- A persuasive letter

RE



In RE this term, we will be looking closely at what people believe about god by exploring a variety of beliefs and stories from the bible.

Science



As Scientists we will be exploring the themes:

Animal Nutrition and the Skeletal System and be able

- Use prior knowledge to ask questions independently.
- Use scientific evidence
- Present data in different ways.
- Identify that animals and humans need skeletons for movement, support and protection.
- Identify and classify animals into dependant on skeleton type.
- Gather evidence and recognise patterns.

Design Technology and Art



In Design Technology we will be focusing on the topic Cook well Eat well. During this topic we will explore a healthy, nutritious diet and select a range of ingredients to design, make and taste our own tacos.

In Art we will be looking at a variety of patterns to create our own prehistoric, clay pots. To complete our final project we will only use tools and resources that would have been available during the Stone Age such as sticks and feathers.
