# World Autism Acceptance Week

World Autism Acceptance week is being celebrated between the 27<sup>th</sup> March – 2<sup>nd</sup> April.

Children will be exploring their likes and dislikes and recognising that we are all good at different things and that is what makes us unique and special. We are excited to celebrate what makes us all unique.

As you may remember, our school were delighted to be taking part in the Umbrella project, and we have George and his mum from Earlsdon primary to thank for gifting this to us.



The Neurodiversity Umbrella Project is created by The ADHD Foundation and is an uplifting visual representation of all the different minds we have here in the UK. Every Umbrella Project installation helps to raise awareness and understanding of neurodiversity. Each display is designed to represent the one in five of us who have a neurodevelopmental condition, such as ADHD, Autism, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia or Tourette's syndrome. These conditions fall under the umbrella term of neurodiversity.

We are excited to learn that our umbrellas are due to be delivered in the coming days and we will be working with the children ahead of the installation going up to raise awareness of Neurodiversity.
