A reminder that this is a ticketless event. Members of the PTA will have a list of the names of children who have bought a ticket when they arrive at the entrance door. Unfortunately, they are unable to admit anyone who does not appear on their list.

Entrance to the school site is via Coat of Arms Bridge Road only and via the following external doors from the playground:

- Reception, Year 1 and 2 Middle Phase doors (between class 2S and 3P)
- Years 3 and 4
 Middle Phase doors (between class 2S and 3P)
- Years 5 and 6
 Upper Phase doors (between class 3/4M and 4P)

Children should be collected via the same doors as entry. All children need to be collected by an adult and will not be allowed to leave site on their own. This especially applies to children in the older years that parents may feel able to walk home unaccompanied, however, in the interest of safeguarding, this will not be allowed from this event.

Items on sale will include: glow sticks, sweets, glitter tattoos and face paints.

A reminder of the following:

- ALL reception children must be accompanied during the event
 - No mobile phones are allowed for children
- Entrance and collection will be via the Coat of Arms Bridge Road entrance only
 - ALL children must be collected by an adult
