Severn Trent Water Visit

On Monday we had an assembly about what happens to dirty water when it leaves our houses. Beth from Severn Trent Water told us that we should only flush the 3 Ps in the toilet. We also learned that it takes 24 hours for the water company to clean the dirty water so that it can go back in the rivers.

Homework

Starting from this week we will be setting weekly spelling homework across the school. This is no longer in the form of a list but instead as a spelling task. Spelling homework will be set **weekly** and feeds into learning in school the following week. The homework may be set through Seesaw or, alternatively, the children may receive a paper copy depending on the task. Homework will be set by **Friday** each week and should be returned the **following Friday**.

Reception - Year1

One week the homework set will be Phonics based. The following week's homework will focus on the year group's common exception words or statutory word lists.

Years 2-6

One week the homework set will be based on the spelling investigation the children are investigating in class with tasks such as collecting a bank of words for a spelling investigation or continuing the investigation at home. The following week's homework will focus on the year group's common exception words or statutory word lists.

Reception, Year 1 and 2 Spring Walk and Years 3 to 6 House Cross Country

These annual events will take place, weather permitting, on Wednesday 20th March at the War Memorial Park at the following times:

Reception parents should wait on the main playground near to the Clamberstack until the reception classes come out.

Years 3 to 6 House Cross Country - 2.30 pm

Parents are invited to come and watch the event by the opening to the park. The start line is in the park opposite the school entrance.

All children in KS2 (Years 3 to 6) should come dressed in their PE kits on Wednesday for the House Cross Country event.

Social Action Projects

Year 3

Over this half term, Year 3 have been looking very closely at completing this year's Social Action Project. The children have been focusing on how they can help our wider community and used a democratic process to vote for 'Helping the Homeless'. As a year group, we brainstormed our ideas and decided to reach out to local charities in order to understand how we can help and support. P3 Coventry got in touch and were able to come in. The charity explained how they help the homeless and the children interviewed Holly who has lived experience.

The workshop was an insightful process and allowed the children to think carefully about their next steps in rolling out a school wide project. Over the next few weeks, we will use the feedback from the charity and look to direct our attention to providing P3 and the homeless with our support.

Year 4

In Year 4, we have been working on a social action project to do with loneliness. As a year group, we had the idea to hold a fair in school. The three things we will be doing are: selling loom bands and books and holding some games. The games consist of lucky dips, penalty shootout, smack the rat, ring toss, pin the tail on the donkey and javelin. We are also selling soft back books which will cost 20p, hard back books which will cost 50p and really good quality books which will cost £1. Lastly, we're selling loom bands. If you would like to purchase one, a normal bracelet would cost 50p, but if you would like one with a charm it would cost £1.

This fair will be on Thursday 21st March. If you would like to join in, please bring in a maximum of £2 but in 10ps, 20ps and 50ps.

Forest School R1 and 2S

Pupils in R1 had an introduction to our Forest School sessions this half term. They were very enthusiastic and well behaved! After learning about natural materials, pupils worked in small groups to make 'a house for a mouse'. They showed great resilience in walking the slippery slopes around the banks of the dell area and learnt about native trees. We worked with them to construct a framework for our willow plants to grow up and in the final week had songs and hot chocolate at a camp fire.

Class 2S were shown how to use loppers safely to cut back plants. The following week they learnt Forest School knots before constructing tripods and had fun decorating them. Week three saw them using magnifying glasses, being detectives and looking for small creatures on our site. Two frogs and a newt were found in the pond as well as many invertebrates. Finally, they were given the opportunity to cook either marshmallows or toast over a fire and many said how they had enjoyed the experience.
