

2023-24 Swimming Report

Standards

By the end of key stage two, children are expected to be able to swim 25m confidently and efficiently, use a range of strokes such as front crawl, back crawl and breast stroke and perform self-safe rescue.

This year, our year 3 children all received swimming lessons at King Henrys. Year 3 had a two-week block including 10 lessons, each 45 minutes long.

Results

From the year 3 cohort, 37/75 children were able to meet the expected end of KS2 standard. This results in 49%. This is a higher result than last year.

Year 6- Data was gathered from the Year 6 parents to identify which children cannot currently meet the standard and these children were put forward for the top up sessions in the Summer Term. 24 children attended a week's top up sessions (40 minutes long) in the summer term 1. 2 children were identified in the first session as already being able to meet the standard, these children did not continue for the remainder of the week. 10/22 are now able to meet the standards which as whole year group is 64/78 totaling 82%. Of the 12 that did not meet the standard, 6 were non swimmers. The other 6 children made good progress from being non swimmers to being able to swim 5-12 meters and beginning to swim a range of strokes. 2 children were offered the top ups but 1 did not reply to indicate if they wanted them and 1 was on holiday.
